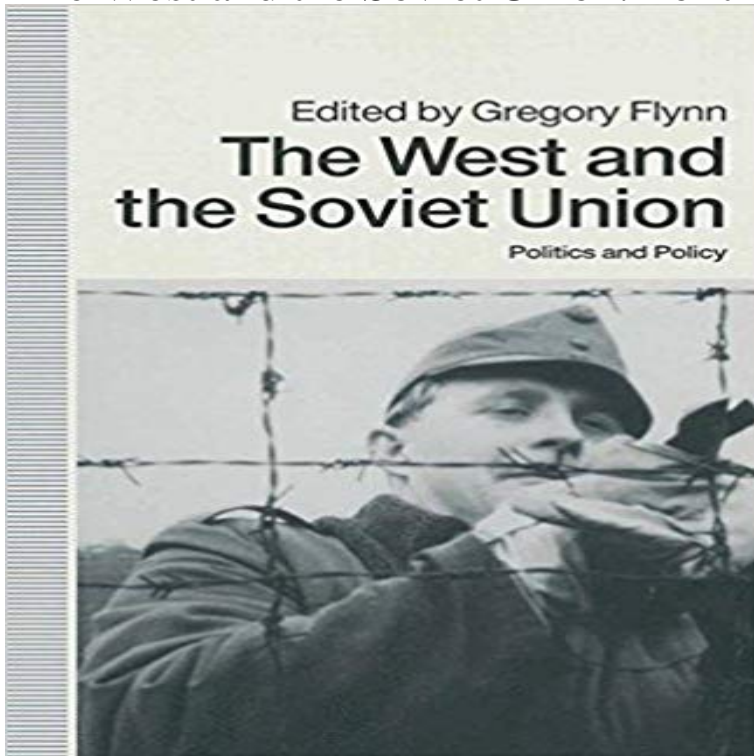


## The West and the Soviet Union: Politics and Policy
